the transition from the valveless natural horn to the modern valved horn in 19th century paris was

different from similar transitions in other countries while valve technology was received happily by players of other members of the brass family strong support for the natural horn with its varied color palette and virtuoso performance traditions slowed the reception and application of the valve to the horn using primary sources including conservatoire method books accounts of performances and technological advances and other evidence this book tells the story of the transition from natural horn to valved horn at the conservatoire from 1792 to 1903 including close examination of horn teaching before the arrival of valved brass in paris the initial reception and application of this technology to the horn the persistence of the natural horn and the progression of acceptance use controversies and eventual adoption of the valved instrument in the parisian community and at the conservatoire active scholars performers and students interested in the horn 19th century brass instruments teaching methods associated with the conservatoire and the intersection of technology and performing practice will find this book useful in its details and conclusions including ramifications on historically informed performance today

this book aims to assist the serious student of music who realizes that much of their professional career will consist of conducting amateurs whether in public schools or church choirs city choirs city bands or community orchestras illustrative pieces of music are drawn from repertoires nonprofessional groups are likely to perform unlike many conducting texts this one helps the young conductor in learning to read and study a score in preparation for their conducting studies

amadeus score reading provides insights into the musical structure of a work that are difficult to obtain from merely listening many listeners and amateurs derive great pleasure from following a performance with score in hand to help them better understand the intricacies of what they are hearing this guide includes practice examples of increasing difficulty taken from scores of well known works from various periods

readers will find the same delight in the affinity of the incongruous the subtlety of the commonplace and the hidden simplicity of the complex only the subject matter is different in this case some of the greatest as well as the most trivial of western music jacket

full and complete with reduced instrumentation of just twelve players four saxes five brass piano bass and drums optional parts are available for flute clarinet horn baritone horn and tuba rhythm section parts offer suggestions for rhythms and piano voicings and guitar chords are included to assist young guitarists solos are written out for improvised sections and there is plenty of full sounding ensemble titles blues in the night burritos to go have yourself a merry little christmas jumpin at the woodside jungle boogie misty night and day on green dolphin street sax to the max summertime take five tastes like chicken
